Having come into God's presence, we read from his word what he requires of us. Because we have not done all that is required of us, this reading serves as a call to confess our sins.

Reading of the Law and Call to Confession

Matthew 7:12

We respond to hearing what God requires of us by confessing our sins with a prayer of confession, typically said in unison. After confessing our sins, we hear God's promise of forgiveness for all who turn from their sin in repentance and believe in Jesus and his death on the cross for our sins. We respond to this promise with thanks and praise in song.

Prayer of Confession Language updated from *The Book of Common Prayer*, The Reformed Episcopal Church.

O most mighty God and merciful Father, who has compassion upon all men, and hates nothing that you have made; who desires not the death of a sinner, but rather that he should turn from his sin and be saved: Mercifully forgive us our trespasses; receive and comfort us, who are grieved and wearied with the burden of our sins. Your property is always to have mercy; to you alone belongs the forgiveness of sins. Spare us therefore, good Lord, spare your people, whom you have redeemed; enter not into judgment with your servants, but so turn your anger from us, who meekly acknowledge our transgressions and truly repent us of our faults; and so make haste to help us in this world, that we may ever live with you in the world to come; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Promise of Forgiveness 1 John 1:9

“If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Psalms 1A

Because we worship God together as one body, we confess our faith in unison, using a statement of faith from one of the creeds, confessions of faith, or catechisms used in the history of the church.

Confession of Faith (in unison) The Apostles' Creed

I believe in God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only begotten Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary; He suffered under Pontius Pilate; was crucified, dead, and buried; he descended into hell; The third day he rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; From there he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Next, we read a selection from the Scriptures because God speaks to us through his written word and commands, “the public reading of Scripture,” so that we may know God, what he has done for us, and what he requires of us.

Scripture Reading James 1:5-8

Next, we come before God in prayer, to praise him, give thanks for his many blessings, ask him to provide for our needs, and to intercede for the needs of others in the church and the world. We conclude by praying the Lord's Prayer in unison.

Prayer and The Lord's Prayer

Our Father who art in heaven, Hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth, as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil: For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever. Amen.

God's people have always worshiped God by giving to him from all that he gives to us and Christians are called to give generously, cheerfully, and sacrificially in response. Afterward, we sing our praise and thanks using the Doxology.

Offering and Doxology (Hymn 570)

At the heart of our worship service is hearing God through the preaching of his word. In the sermon, God's word is read, explained, and applied to our lives. We always ask for the help of the Holy Spirit so that we may hear God's word with understanding.

When we receive these elements with faith, he is spiritually present and we truly eat his body and drink his blood. Both wine and grape juice are served, and the communion bread is gluten free.
